FROM THE DEAN

In case you missed Sunday mass on August 20th, I have some very interesting news to report, which I hope encourages your hearts.

I still have Parkinson's. A brain scan that I had done six months ago showed a marked asymmetric hormone metabolizing/producing area of my brain, which is part of the spectrum of issues that cause movement disorders like Parkinson's. I've been saying how, since Ascension Sunday, when the whole congregation anointed me and prayed for my healing, that I have been feeling stronger, and folks have remarked on it frequently, how my speech has improved, and that I look stronger.

Well, I had the same brain scan done on Friday, and that part of my brain that was not working is now working normally! It baffled the neurologist at Mayo, who could only reason that the first scan was wrong. I told him that my family, friends, and church have been praying for my

healing, and that this was a gift from God to glorify him and to be an encouragement and sign of hope a joy for me and St. Paul! I am cautious about calling something a miracle, especially since I still have Parkinson's, and the brain changes may take time to show improvement. But, wow! The brain scans are polar opposites after prayer and anointing.

I truly believe it to be the manifestation of the healing touch of Jesus! I don't know what this means for my future health, but I will continue to trust in the Lord and in your continued love and prayers.

Because the people of St. Paul so lovingly anointed me and prayed for me, and continue in prayer full of hope... because of love... the Lord has done something wonderful, and yes, miraculous!

The Lord is with us, and is working in and through us, and has much for us to become and do through his Son, Jesus Christ, and in the power of his Holy Spirit!

healing prayer


Community was most-mentioned experience during the recent Conversation about events involving praying for Fr. Troy in May.* Healing prayer was next, followed by Amazement, Holy Spirit and Love. Seated six to a table, 60 people shared stories and experiences on July 9. About 30 wrote down thoughts and ideas. Although many had not been in church on 5-28, by the end of the conversation they were ready to add their thoughts.

Beyond these categories came compassion for the visitor; enjoyment of telling and listening to stories; opportunity for healing in Sunday worship with clergy and prayer teams, and a fresh look at the "Prayers of the People" as a community activity.

SAINT PAUL'S SUMMER FOOD PROGRAM

It was a very successful year! We served an average of 12,000 meals, including breakfast, lunch and snack. United Way is working on OpportUNITY Community Plan regarding food insecurity in central Iowa with a video production company and they have been to 3 of our sites. Troy was anointed with holy oil for healing in body, mind and spirit. During communion, a visitor strode up the aisle, cursing the building and the people in it. Fr. Troy calmly declared God's love and ours. The woman left. Fr. Troy rebuked the curses and blessed us including the strange visitor. 10 o'clock service: Fr. Troy again requested healing prayer. The congregation, joined by the choir, gathered around him, praying silently or aloud in English or their native language.

CHAPTER RETREAT

Most Chapter and Cathedral Staff met on Saturday, July 22nd for a Chapter Retreat. The theme of the retreat was how we can Invite, Welcome and Connect. Father Troy opened the day with Morning Prayer and then led us in a discussion about the wonderful things happening at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul's and how we can better Invite, Welcome and Connect so others have the opportunity to share what we love about the Cathedral. We met in small groups, and then cam back together and chose six things we would like to focus on the coming months.

I am sure many of you will be asked for your input and assistance as we execute the six ideas to better Invite, Welcome and Connect. Thank you in advance.

Also, many thanks to Elvin McDonald and John Zickefoose for hosting us for a potluck dinner on Friday night before the retreat. We are very appreciative to St. Timothy's for hosting the retreat.

WON'T YOU CONSIDER BEING AN ACOLYTE?

An acolyte is a very important part of the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. As our Book of Common Prayer states: At all celebrations of the Liturgy, it is fitting that the principal celebrant, whether bishop or priest, be assisted by other priests, and by deacons and lay persons.

There can be one or more acolytes in a service. Acolyte roles include Crucifer (carrying the cross), Torchbearer (carrying a candle), Thurifer (carrying incense), and Table Server (helping the celebrant during the Eucharist). No matter the role, acolytes try their best to blend into the background of the service so nothing takes away attention from the celebration.

At St. Paul's, acolytes vest in a black cassock and white surplice. An acolytes service begins before many people even get to church! Acolytes arrive early, vest, then light the



candles on the altar before the service begins. They then check with the clergy for any special instructions for the service. During the service, they perform the tasks assigned to them based on their role for the day (e.g. Crucifer or Torchbearer). After the service is over, the altar candles are reverently extinguished.

Acolytes can be children or adults, the only requirement is a solemn desire to serve God and our fellow parishioners. Anyone interested in becoming an acolyte should check with the Deacon John Doherty deacon so training can be arranged. Deacon John can be contacted via email

SANCTUARY DISCERNMENT TEAM UPDATE

In the July/August issue of the Journey, we provided a brief overview of the New Sanctuary Movement, including what it is and what the options are for participating. The issue also looked at St. Paul's history with justice and mercy, and we gave a brief recap of our team discussions centering around our call as a church in light of St. Paul's specific history. Below is a summary of what we talked about over the summer.

 Deacon John led us in a theological reflection on hospitality. Here are some of our salient takeaways from that conversation:

Grace is going along with something as it happens and as it grows, rather than having to jump into the totally of something all at once.

It is better to have failed at something than to never have tried it. It is a good (and difficult) practice to become comfortable being uncomfortable.

Self-knowledge (individual and collective) is super important for making decisions.

2. We talked about the intersection of spiritual and civic identity; how we think about being "American" and how our faith influences the way engage in politics and public life. Many people mentioned that being American to them means having a great deal of privilege and freedom, and along with that a great deal of responsibility to use those things well. We also talked about how arbitrary national identity is, being based on the random lottery of where you were born, and yet how deeply it informs who we are and how we are able to move about the world. Finally, we talked about

how being American can mean holding a lot of tension internally and socially - between ideals and practices, or between community and governance. This was the last formal conversation in our initial step of self-reflection and internal probing of identity, values, and motivations.
